- D. if not enough information is given to decide.

Column A

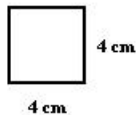
$$(2 \times 5) + 1$$

$$(2 \times 10) + 5$$

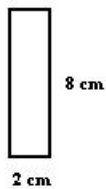
